Yale R. Burge Competition

The Yale R. Burge Competition recognizes outstanding design and presentation skills of interior design students in the final year of undergraduate study. The competition is based on a comparative assessment of students' portfolio presentations. The competition is designed to encourage students to seriously plan their portfolios. Judges will evaluate presentation skills, design and planning competency and conceptual creativity.

HOW TO APPLY

Deadline

March 1, 2010

Eligibility

The Yale R. Burge Competition is open to all interior design students in their final year of undergraduate study. Portfolio components may include work that is as diverse as a lighting plan, graphic, sketch, furniture or cabinetry detail, paper flow chart or lifecycle cost analysis presentation, as well as the more usual furniture layout, color board and perspective rendering. Any one of these items equals one component. Any combination of these components may be used, but under no circumstances may the total exceed 12 components.

Application Process

1. Complete online application
2. Email application to foundation@asid.org
 - Portfolio presentation (slide presentation, Microsoft PowerPoint presentation, HTML format)
 - o Each item must be clearly marked with the last four digits of the applicant's social security number and a number that denotes its sequence in the presentation, i.e., 1, 2, 3 ...
 - o The applicant's name or school must not be visible either on or within the portfolio presentation. The validity of the jury's evaluation is based on the total anonymity of the competitors. The applicant's name and school should only appear on the actual application.
 - Photo (300 dpi in jpeg or gif format)

Finalist and Winners

The ASID Foundation will review all submissions and select winners based on the stated criteria. The decision of the jury process will be final. All entrants will be notified of their status by mail in April 2010. Award payments will be made directly to the student. Winners will be recognized publicly through a variety of print and electronic media.
